## **From the Vicar – “I thank my God for you each time I think of you.”**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I thank the Lord for you and give Him the glory.*

*And even when we are apart, you are always in my heart.  
We are bonded by God's Holy Spirit.*

We give voice to one great Alleluia.*

This upcoming year will be one of many challenges as Nancy, Megan, Ryan and I continue our seminary journey: finishing those final classes and anticipating the approval and assignment processes. Your continued prayers as we go through this Spirit-led process will sustain us all.

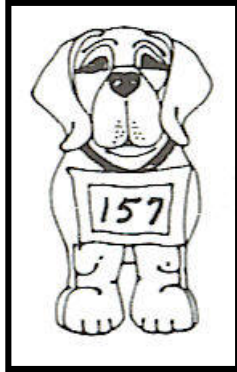

## STAFF NOTES

### Freeze Frame

As a child, when caught sticking out my tongue at my brother, I would receive the following warning from my mother: “Your face is going to freeze like that!”

Surely that couldn’t be true, I reasoned, even though my mother was generally trustworthy in all matters. Could my face really stay frozen in such an ugly visage? Naaahhhhh. But then again . . .

Perhaps Mom’s words were more accurate than I realized back then. Just last week I read a newspaper article quoting dermatologist Dr. Marilyn Berzin, who said women patients are coming to her with concerns about lines and wrinkles around their lips. Turns out they have “water bottle lips.” Their daily addiction to drinking from plastic water bottles is leading to early development of permanent lines from pursed lips. (I can almost hear my mother’s voice: “Your face is going to freeze like that!”)

If drinking from water bottles (not to mention constant frowning or glaring or pouting or scolding or grimacing) leaves permanent marks on our faces, then we might instead consider how to use our lips, our tongue, our mouths in ways that shape us well, and for the good.

The Psalms give us guidance here. Psalm 51, so familiar as the penitential psalm appointed for Ash Wednesday and the start of the season of Lent, moves from that penitence to the hope of forgiveness, and then on to a gesture of praise and thankfulness: *Deliver me from bloodshed, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance. O Lord, open my lips and my mouth will declare your praise.* (Psalm 51:14-15) Would that our faces might freeze **this** way—a constant attitude of gratitude to God for all God has done!

Or take Psalm 141, which reads in vs. 3: *Set a guard over my mouth, O Lord; keep watch over the door of my lips.* Would that our faces might freeze **this** way—that we would find a constant watchfulness and self-control over the sin that so easily erupts from our mouths, be it gossip, lies, simple complaining or outright hateful language.

In both cases, the Psalmist indicates these are pleas and prayers for the Lord God to make it so in us—open my lips, set a guard over my mouth. We cannot make such faces on our own, but only with the Holy Spirit dwelling in us and moving us to do so.

Ultimately, the facial expressions most pleasing to God, and most faithful to our baptismal calling as God’s children, will be expressions of love for God and neighbor. And it will not be necessary for corrective surgery to remove the lines and wrinkles which develop from these actions. Rather, such lines and wrinkles will be regarded by God as beauty marks.

- One pencil sharpener.
- One 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- One eraser approximately 2½" long.
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons.

These items may be brought to the Gathering Space collection closet and placed in the box marked "SCHOOL KITS" no later than August 31, 2008. Due to your generosity last year we currently have a surplus of pencils and construction paper. Cash donations will also be accepted and will be used to cover the shipping and handling costs to forward these kits overseas.
