## Trinity Welcomes the Rev. Dr. Jack Horner

We rejoice that the Rev. Dr. Jack Horner has been called as Lead Pastor to Trinity and joined the staff on Sunday, June 16. In the last month, we've had opportunities to meet this gifted and passionate shepherd and we've welcomed him, his wife Linda, and their four children, Genesis, Joshua, John and Krista to our Trinity family. Continuing this time of celebration, all are encouraged to attend a special worship service and his official installation at Trinity on Sunday afternoon, September 22. Watch the announcements for additional details about this event.

As we prayed for his arrival earlier this year, we learned that Pastor Horner attended Wittenberg University and Gettysburg Seminary, and later completed a Doctor of Ministry degree in Christian Leadership. He was called to urban ministry in 1991 where he served Redeemer in Queens, New York, starting a Christian nursery school, a Latino ministry, and a summer youth



program. Later, he joined Resurrection in Mount Kisco, NY in 1999 and started a contemporary service, a Christian nursery school, and participated in an interfaith homeless ministry.

In 2009, he joined the staff at the Metropolitan New York Synod as the Director of Evangelical Mission. His main tasks were consulting with congregations on mission, evangelism and stewardship, organizing strategic initiatives in the synod, supervising ministries receiving partnership support grants, and encouraging generosity

for mission throughout the synod. We also learned that he climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro in Africa, to a height of 19,340 feet, to raise money for the ELCA's Malaria Campaign.

With joy and excitement, we give thanks for Pastor Horner who now leads us in mission and ministry. We look forward to the many ways that, together, our ministry will be blessed to continue in some old and some new ways and as we grow in faith.

## “Coming Home”

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As the congregational votes were being tallied for your call to me as your next lead pastor, my father shared with a member of the call committee that our family was actually from Cumberland County, going back at least to the early 1800's. It was a bit of information I didn't know. I knew the Ho(e)rner's hailed from central Pennsylvania with at least three generations in Lancaster County, but it was a pleasant surprise to find the ancestral homeland is within 10 minutes of Trinity Church. I'm coming home.

The idea of return and restoration is important in scripture. Think of all the people of the bible for whom "coming home" was a significant part of their experience: Noah and his family with receding waters, Jacob reconciling with his brother, the prophets pleading with the kings and people to return to the

observation of the Law. Jesus' story begins with a return to an ancestral hometown, Bethlehem and in John's gospel ends with the disciples meeting Jesus where they first met him, on the shores of their home on the Sea of Galilee. The prodigal son returned home and was restored by his father and the centaurian returned home on Jesus' instruction to find his servant well. If "home is where the heart is," the heart of God is for us to be at home with Him.

I want to invite us all into this home coming. Jesus says when one person returns home to God the angels in heaven celebrate with a party! Imagine each Sunday we gather around the means of grace an occasion for homecoming, celebration, and restoration! Welcome home!

# Stewardship Begins at Home: Debt

Have you ever purchased something that costs more than you could pay in cash? It's okay to answer a resounding yes, many of us have. Often, we buy a home this way (with a 30-year mortgage), or a vehicle (with a four-year loan).

Purchasing "big ticket" items like real estate and cars, using debt, is as American as apple pie. But, what happens when our lifestyle leads us to purchase more and more of the things we must have with a loan or a credit card? What happens when we make routine monthly purchases using debt?

Have you ever known someone who took on more debt than their income could handle? Maybe it's even happened to you? What can we do to solve an imbalance between our current income and our current debt payments?

First things first, stop buying non-essential stuff. Stop making the problem worse.

Next, let's review how we got where we are. Let's make a list: it would include all our debts, to whom the debt is owed, the total amount of each debt, the percentage interest-rate being charged, and the required monthly payment. Put any home mortgages at the top of the list, followed by "secured" debt (backed by something tangible) like vehicle loans, and finish with the "unsecured" loans like credit card purchases. These might be for items that get "used up" and are not backed by something tangible, for instance, loans to pay monthly utility bills like electric, heating, water and sewer, or even food.

Next question, do you have the income to support (repay) all of your required monthly debt payments? If the answer is no, make an appointment with a debt counselor immediately, you need serious help.

Now, for the rest of us, who think we can afford the debt we have ...

Let's work on our credit card debt. Do you remember what was purchased with your card, leading to your current balance? In hindsight, do you wish you had forgone some of those purchases? Have you had to deny yourself the purchase of something more desirable since?

Let's try something together. Let's stop using our credit cards and put them away for the next month. During this month, let's focus on making a payment to pay off - or start paying off - one of the outstanding credit card balances. If your credit card balance is paid off before the month ends, start paying extra on the next debt item on your list. At the end of a month or two, it's time to review and update our debt list. The total amount of debt owed should be less. How will you feel when you reduce your debt? More financially secure, with some of your debt burden removed? You bet.

Do you recall a desirable thing that you thought of purchasing but didn't? Congratulate yourself. You're putting some financial discipline into your life. Reward yourself by staying focused on reducing your debt. Every three-to-six months review and update your debt list. The feeling of financial security will only get better. Other than our faith and love of family, financial security is as good as life gets.

## Automated Online Giving Comes To Trinity

Have you ever seen a matrix barcode like the one displayed here? Have you wondered what in the world it is? Welcome to the world of "QR codes," short for Quick Response Codes. These are barcodes similar to a scanner code you find on a food package. QR codes can be read by using a QR code scanner, often from a smartphone.



Trinity has a new QR Code. To use it, first install a QR reader on your phone, by going to your phone's "app store" and searching for a QR reader. You'll find several free apps. Install an app and hold your phone's camera over the code to read it.

The QR code displayed here will take you to Trinity's secure eGiving web page. After using your phone to read this QR Code, you can click the Trinity "on-line eGiving page" link. You'll see several options to donate to Trinity. For instance, you could choose to have automatic payments made directly to Trinity, from your bank account or with a credit card. Please contact Paul Hensel if you have questions.

This secure automatic online giving system:

- assures Trinity receives your donation, even if you are out of town or forget your checkbook.
- makes it easy for you to plan your giving for the week, month, or even year!
- makes program planning more reliable, with consistent member giving.
